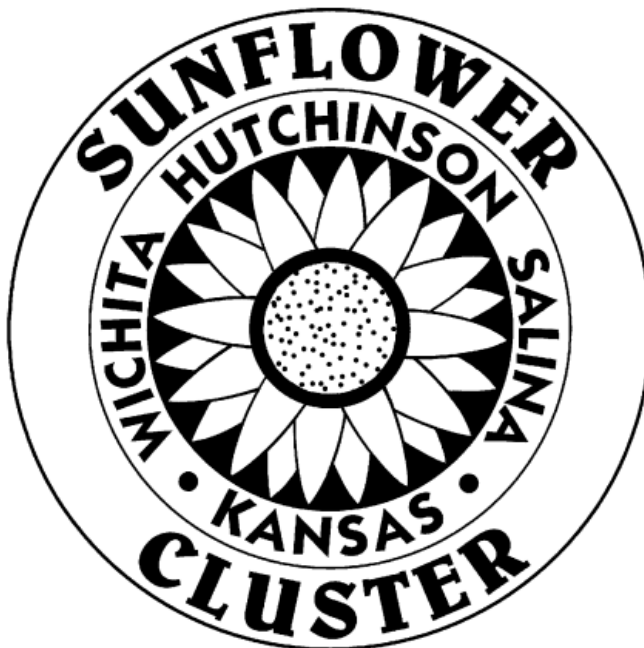
## A Word from the WKC President Jackie Storrer

May 9, 2022

The business portion of the meeting started at 8:10 PM.

Eleven members were present with two guests.

**Treasurer, Tom Chase** – Tom filled in for Jackie Storer. He asked if everyone had seen a copy of last month's meeting minutes. All said they had seen the minutes in the newsletter. Mike Williams moved, and Tom Street seconded, to accept the minutes as published. The motion passed unanimously.

**Corresponding Secretary, Mike Williams** – Mike said he had received an e-mail from Becky Entz from the Hutchinson Kennel Club with a diagram on how Meet the Breeds will be laid out in the Horse Arena at the Kansas State Fair Grounds. Participants should bring plenty of water for themselves and their dogs and an extension cord with a fan or a battery powered fan to keep their dogs cool. Tables will be furnished, but they have only a limited number of chairs. (Might be a good idea to bring your own chair.) Meet the Breeds will be held on Wednesday, 14 Sep 2022.

**Recording Secretary, Mike Williams** – Nothing to report. Mike reminded all to look for the minutes in the club newsletter. If you are not getting the newsletter, then let Leanne Chase know.

**Treasurer's Report** – Tom said there were no changes from last month's report. He added that he had sent the club's income taxes in on time.

## NEW CHANGES FOR FOREIGN-VACCINATED DOGS WITH A CDC DOG IMPORT PERMIT

All importers are now eligible to import dogs.

**Importers of personal pet dogs** from high-risk countries are now eligible to apply for a [CDC Dog Import Permit](#), and may receive up to two permits (i.e., permits for two dogs). Personal pet owners no longer need to provide documentary proof of eligibility. Foreign-vaccinated dogs arriving from high-risk countries with a valid permit will be allowed to enter if the dogs are six months of age or older (photos of dogs' teeth are required for age verification), have a microchip, have a valid rabies vaccination certificate from a non-US-licensed veterinarian issued on or after the date the dog was 12 week old and at least 28 days prior to entry, have a serologic evidence of rabies vaccination (titer) with the sample collected between 45-365 days before entry; and arrive at one of the 18 CDC-approved ports of entry. Within 10 days of arrival, foreign-vaccinated dogs with a CDC Dog Import Permit must receive a USDA-licensed rabies booster vaccination by a U.S. veterinarian.

The new rules go into effect on June 10, 2022, and will remain in effect at least through January 31, 2023.

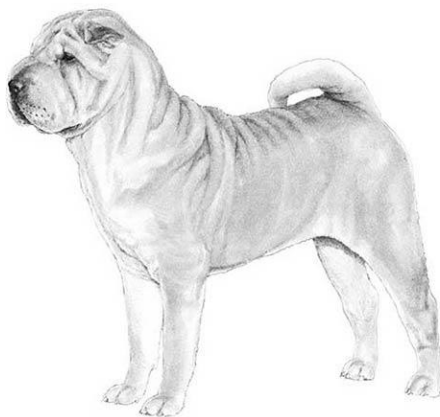
## NOSE WORK NOTES

I keep seeing confusion at what level dogs should trial. Here are the guidelines and explanations:

### Section 2. Class Eligibility.

- Novice A Classes are open to dogs who have not completed any title for that particular element, who have not completed a comparable title with another organization, and whose handlers are neither Scent Work judges, nor have ever worked as professional detection dog handlers.
- Novice B Classes are open to all dogs.
- Advanced Classes are open to dogs who have achieved the Novice title for that particular element.
- Excellent Classes are open to dogs who have achieved the Advanced title for that particular element.
- Master Classes are open to dogs who have achieved the Excellent title for that particular element.
- The Detective Class is open to dogs who have achieved any Master title within the Odor Search Division.

Dogs that have previously earned the same or higher level AKC Scent Work titles may enter lower level classes.

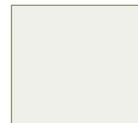
