I brought my computer to the board room to work with Nikki Winzer on the Sunflower Cluster premium and I must say the new internet and Wi-Fi works great. I am not a

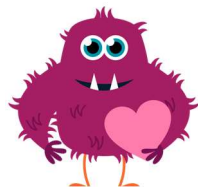
computer person and my laptop worked flawlessly. I am so glad we finally have internet access and Wi-Fi at our facility.

Board Meeting Highlights

November 20, 2024

1. The board reviewed 11 prospective member applications.
2. Debbie Snider to start CGC classes on January 6th, 2025.
3. Lisa Smith to start Conformation classes on January 6th, 2025.
4. The Cluster is looking for a judge for the Chinese Crested breed.
5. Door Code system was reviewed, and old door keys need to be given to Jerry Watkins.
6. Patricia Swearingen reviewed with the Board her General Meeting programs she has planned for 2025.
7. Andrea English is putting together the Annual Membership booklet and needs everyone to respond with any updated information. The budget was set at \$1000.
8. Barn Hunt was discussed and what is needed more than anything is someone to take on the job as Barn Hunt Coordinator. We also need a place, preferably in a barn or building large enough to hold a match and maybe even a trial. We are going to need a place to store our hay and someone to manage and feed the rats.
9. Nikki, Trial Chair for our Spring Scent Work Trial, reviewed the trial and asked to proceed with the down payment on the grounds and facilities. The Board approved to move forward with her dates and go ahead and put money down.
10. Charlotte Norris would like to bring in some amazing people for a Scent Work Seminar such as Holly Bushard or Jon Sarabia. Charlotte would like to speak with the scent work folks to see how much interest there would be. Charlotte is looking at a summer seminar.
11. Our building use was discussed but no action taken.
12. Pam Watkins, Spring Fast Cat Test Chair, reported that Adara Van Ravenswaaij has volunteered to be the Fast Cat Test Secretary.
13. Pam Watkins requested that we take down the whiteboard calendar in the general meeting room since we have a calendar on the WKC website. The Board agreed.
14. Charlotte Norris would like to hold a class on "How to read your dog". She would video each dog and play them on the new TV and discuss. She said she would also like to have a concepts class. The Board agreed.
15. Pam Watkins would like to invest in CDs with \$25,000 for a building fund. The Board discussed this in detail and Pam Watkins made a motion to investigate rates and put \$25,000 into CDs. All board members were in favor. Jerry Watkins will review different interest rates on CDs.
16. Jerry Watkins reported that we have a roof leak. There are two (2) areas that are leaking. They were noticeable after the last hard rain. Jerry will check with a roofer on cost to repair.

Wichita Kennel Club Dog Show Turns 100!

I would like to thank Joe Miller for sharing some very cool news about our club that might have gone unnoticed had he not made us aware.

While going through some old paperwork and trying to clear out things I no longer need to keep (and not being very successful at it, by the way), I came across a photocopy of the catalog from the club's very first dog show.

It was held over three days on March 2nd, 3rd and 4th, 1925. That would make this year the 100th anniversary of our first dog show. That is quite a milestone and one I thought might be of interest to the current membership through a mention in the newsletter.

There was only one judge for the entire show—all classes, groups and Best in Show. The judge was John W Burton of Chicago, Illinois. The show was supervised by Mr. & Mrs. A. W. Brockway from Barrington, Illinois.

Many (most) of the breeds we currently see at shows were not yet recognized by the AKC so there was no entry listed for them. The information about the individual entries could also include the

price for those dogs available for sale. A quick scan of the catalog showed one dog priced at \$1,000 (a Boston Terrier). That must have been quite the asking price back in 1925. In today's dollars, that would be \$18,000! I wonder if it sold.

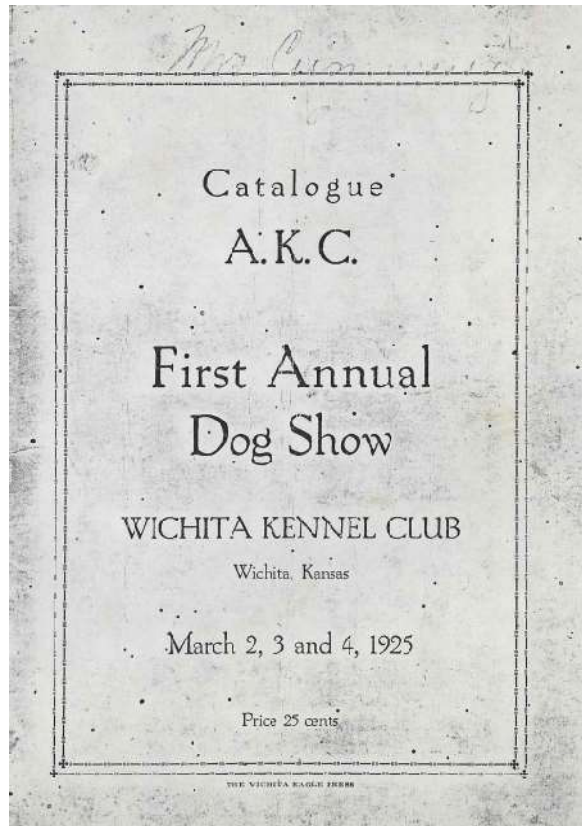
There were only five groups recognized then—Sporting, Working, Terriers, Toys and Non-Sporting. It was common to enter a dog in more than one class. The classes consisted of Puppy (split

between 6 to 9 months and 9 to 12 months), Novice, American Bred, Limit and Open. There didn't appear to be a Bred by Exhibitor class nor a separate Best of Breed or Variety.

The largest entry breed appeared to be Boston Terriers, Collies, English Setters and Shepherds (What we now know as German Shepherds I assume but they were only

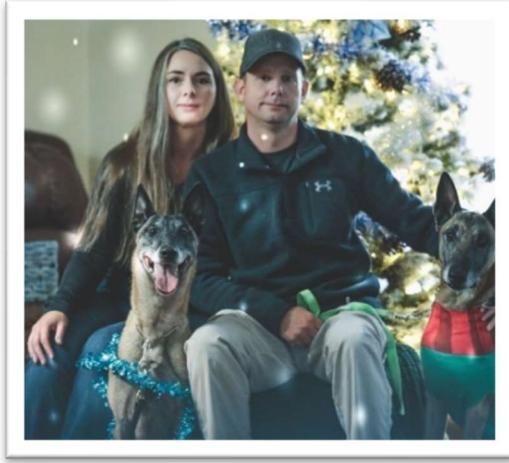
listed as Shepherds). There was no summary of entries that I could find so not sure exactly how many dogs were entered but it appears to be a couple of hundred at best. All in all, it is kind of fascinating to see how the Club started.

That's it for today's history lesson!



Meet The Member

Now that Kim is getting a little bit older she is working towards taking on a less physical job, and is currently finishing her certification process to become a Biology teacher.

Kim has lived most of her life in Kansas, but also spends time at their property in Oklahoma with her husband of nine and a half years.

She has been a member of WKC for three years.

Kim says she's incredibly grateful to the WKC for being open to offering new sports in our area. Committees & Positions Available to Members

ANNUAL AWARDS BANQUET: Plan annual awards dinner. The awards go to members who have bred or own a dog that has completed a championship or an AKC performance title. Committee duties include arrangements (menu, entertainment, program, etc.) Two (2) sub-committees (made up of past honorees) determine winners of the Breeder and Service Awards.

Budget: Printing, program, meals, plaques, etc.

BREEDER REFERRAL SERVICE: Maintains a printed list of reputable breeders in the immediate & Midwestern areas covering as many AKC breeds as possible. Also maintains a list of national breed clubs & other organizations, addresses & phone numbers which may be helpful in serving the public. This committee deals directly with the public & members. Person MUST be knowledgeable of various breeds, AKC rules, registration matters, etc.

Budget: none

BUDGET: Meets at least once during the year & examines past income & expenditures. Considers budget needs for the coming year and presents proposed budget to the WKC Board of Directors in January of each year for approval. Research & make recommendations to the Board as to investing club funds. Normally chaired by the Treasurer.

Budget: copy work and postage.

CONFORMATION CLASSES: Organizes classes, conformation training and teaches ring procedures, etc.

Budget: Self funding

EYE CLINICS: Responsible for the annual Eye Clinic. Duties include securing building, arranging for the Ophthalmologist, scheduling workers.

Budget: Self funding

FACILITIES MANAGER: Includes sub-committees that oversee Building & Grounds; Landscaping & Improvements; Security; Kitchen Management & Finance.

HISTORIAN: Responsible for organizing all WKC records including minutes, show catalogs, photographs, news articles & other information of historical note.

Budget: None

JUDGES SELECTION: Responsible for hiring judges for our annual conformation dog show. Responsibilities include soliciting suggestions from members, researching judge availability, correspondence, assigning judges, completing & mailing judges' contracts.

Budget: postage & printing

K9 CORNERS: Arranges with local organizations such as schools, hospitals, nursing homes, etc., to conduct dog-oriented programs. Receives AKC PEC information for club. Duties include selecting members/dogs for visits and organizing the demonstrations and other public events.

Budget: as approved by the Board of Directors

LEGISLATIVE: Made up of representatives to monitor and report to AKC any local legislative initiatives that may affect the interest of our members. Works with Newsletter Editor to keep membership informed.

Budget: Postage, copy work

MATCHES: Responsible for setting dates, arranging for sites, securing approval from AKC, hiring judges, printing & mailing entry forms, arranging equipment & overseeing WKC's matches, accepting entries, setting up rings & management of matches.

Budget: self funding

MEMBERSHIP: Greets visitors to WKC meetings, maintains monthly meeting roster, presents new membership applications to the Board of Directors, & interfaces with Newsletter Editor on potential new member publication. Corresponds and cooperates with Treasurer regarding flowers for illness or memorials in the event of the death of a member or a death in a member's immediate family.

Budget: Postage, copy work, flowers or memorials

NEWSLETTER: Compiling & publishing monthly newsletter. Duties include soliciting information and emailing. Newsletter is used as monthly Membership Meeting notice and should reach membership five days prior to meeting date.

Budget: None

NOMINATING: This committee meets to select a slate of officers & Board as prescribed by the By-laws.

Budget: None

Committees & Positions Available to Members (cont.)

PROGRAMS DIRECTOR: This position arranges for all programs presented at the monthly General Membership Meeting, after interfacing with the President and/or Board of Directors (who have set the calendar for the year). Duties include selecting topics, finding speakers or films, scheduling programs & informing the Newsletter Editor of upcoming program subjects. Also follows up in the next newsletter with a report on program.

Budget: Approved program costs

PUBLICITY: Responsible for acquiring publicity for all WKC events, such as matches, special programs, classes, etc., and works with local media to promote WKC. Show publicity may be handled separately.

Budget: as approved by the Board of Directors

SHOW COMMITTEE: Sunflower Cluster Chairperson is appointed by the President with Board of Directors approval. This committee is in charge of the annual show including applying for the AKC approval of show dates & judges, ring stewards, trophies, working with the Cluster Coordinator and other cluster clubs. This committee involves a great deal of work before the show dates as well as on the show dates. They will compile the premium list information, arrange for trophy purchases and donations, local catalog advertising sales, local publicity, etc. This committee is comprised of several smaller sub-committees that deal only with the Wichita show, i.e. ring stewards, trophies, local advertising & publicity, building & grounds, crating, catalog ads, catalog sales, hospitality, security, speakers stand, etc.

Budget: self funding

SUNFLOWER CLUSTER COORDINATOR:

The Coordinator is appointed by the President with Board of Directors approval. The Coordinator is responsible for the items that affect all four (4) clubs in the Sunflower Cluster, maintaining a good working relationship with the staff of the hosting location, being sure our dates are reserved well in advance & that all the building arrangements have been made. Coordinator is responsible for the appointment of the committees chosen from all four (4) clubs. The list of committees should be presented at a Cluster meeting from approval by the Cluster clubs. The committees include, but are not limited to, Judges' Liaison, General Facilities

(Building, Grounds & Sanitation), Trophies, Reserved Crating, Free Crating, Security & Parking, National Advertising, National Publicity, Hospitality, Agility, Obedience, Other Performance Events, Ring Stewarding, Vendor Booths and Breed Seminars. The Cluster Coordinator interfaces with the Art Show at the Dog Show Chairperson, Show Veterinarian, Show Photographer, etc., sets the dates for the Cluster meetings and distributes the agendas for the Cluster meetings to the appropriate persons. Submits Cluster committee information as required to the Superintendent in a timely fashion according to our deadlines.

Budget: copy work, supplies for Cluster as needed

SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT: This committee is responsible for buying, maintaining & inventory of office & show equipment owned by the WKC and/or Sunflower Cluster cargo trailer or items occasionally stored in individual members homes. This committee also has the responsibility of making recommendations to the Board of Directors or Cluster for further purchase of needed equipment & the ordering of same.

Budget: as approved by the Board of Directors

WDTC REPRESENTATIVE: Upon appointment & presentation of letter from the WKC Board of Directors stating that such person has been asked to attend the board meetings of the Wichita Dog Training Club. This individual attends WDTC board meetings and reports back to the WKC Board of Directors at their monthly meetings or by verbal or written report to the WKC President. This position maximizes communications between the two clubs.

Budget: none

WEBSITE: Designs and updates the website on a regular or as needed basis. Maintains website with current information and activities of the club. Visits other websites in order to keep the club website current and relevant.

Budget: As approved by the Board of Directors

AKC News

AKC Event Service Fees to Increase

The following is from AKC:

Dear AKC Club Presidents, Secretaries, and Delegates,

We are writing to inform you of an upcoming change to the event service fee, which will take effect on October 1, 2025. The current fee of \$3.00 per entry will increase to \$4.50 per entry, while the \$0.50 recoding fee will remain unchanged.

This adjustment, the first since 2008, reflects the increasing cost of living (COLA). According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics' CPI Inflation Calculator, the value of \$3.00 in place for 16 years is equivalent to \$4.47 as of June 2024. We made a similar adjustment in 2023 to the Delegate expense reimbursements, which increased from \$200 to \$400.

While we have worked diligently to maintain the current fee structure, consistently rising costs have made it increasingly difficult to do so. The revenue generated from this fee is essential to supporting over 29,000 events held annually and funding important AKC initiatives that allow us to continue serving dogs and the dog community and advancing our mission.

We trust this advance notice provides you with ample time to plan accordingly.

Thank you for your understanding as we navigate these necessary adjustments to ensure the ongoing success of our programs. If you have any questions or would like further details, please don't hesitate to contact us. We're always happy to hear from you and are happy to discuss this change further.
